Create Space - Term 2

The Create Space project has been a resounding success in its second term. The young people have responded to the arts workshops with enthusiasm and willingness to engage and the project partners have been highly supportive.

The sessions this term are being delivered at the Dunoon Grammar School Learning Centre where young people have mild to complex learning needs. These range from Autistic Spectrum Disorder to emotional/behavioural needs. COS staff are working closely with teachers and assistants to ensure that the needs of the young people are met and that they were supported throughout.

The workshops are led by artist Bonita Ellmore and young people are encouraged to express their creativity, celebrate their individuality and share their thoughts and feelings about their lives. We are currently in week three of six visual art sessions split into one-hour workshops with groups of six young people in each. Throughout the project Bonita has used a variety of media including print-making, clay, painting, and stencilling. It is her aim for the young people to complete screen-printed T-shirts by end of this term. Jane Dee will be assisting Bonita for two sessions in March and Kirsty (Argyll Abode) will be introducing Makrame in two workshops at Kirn Primary School. We currently have our trainee, Zuzannah from DGS Advanced Higher Art Department assisting in the majority of the workshops and hope to have one other trainee join the project from mid-February.

Supporting Communites Fund

After February half term holiday Bonita will also be running five workshops in Kirn Primary school for the Supporting Communities Fund.

Exhibition

We have provisionally booked Dunoon Burgh Hall's main hall on the 25th an 26th of April to display the entirety of the work produced by partner schools. DBH have also offered us their cafe space to exhibit a selection of work for up to two months from this date onwards. It is hoped to have two COS artists run workshops for schools on these dates and invite all participants to view their work at Dunoon Burgh Hall.
